

South wall of the funerary chapel of pyramid at Meroë.

This inscription is probably from Queen Shanadakhete (d. 160 B.C.). Seated behind Shanadakhete is her husband. At Meroë the candace system of government made the Queen Mother the central political figure, and the queens were either the principal ruler or at least equal to their husbands as co-ruler.
